## Call to Order:

- 1. Welcome Geary called the meeting to order at 8:08am; Notice of the opens meeting act was posted.
- 2. Attendance Dahlkoetter took roll call of attendees.
- **3. Approval of minutes** Blackman motioned to approve minutes, Love seconded, roll call: All yays, no nays, motion carried.

### **Regular Agenda**

 Review of Request from Magnolias for parking lot event Amy and Kate presented their plans to host a community garage yard sale and flea market in parking lot B-1. They mentioned they weren't aware of the process for closing the parking lot and

wanted to see if they needed barricades. This would take place in conjunction with Fork Fest in downtown Norfolk on July 20. Barnhill suggested they reach out to the organizers of Fork Fest and fill out an event guide with the City of Norfolk.

- 2. Update on Façade and Signage improvement grants awarded Moved to future meeting
- 3. Update on trees, plantings, and cutouts on 4<sup>th</sup> street. Connie said the cut outs are done and the city hauled away the concrete. DayCo construction donated their time to cut out the cement. Geary presented pictures of potential further development of the area, including benches and artwork. The total cost of the chairs would be \$1800.00, and it would take 3 weeks to get them. Love is going to check into pricing on the artwork.

Planting of trees is going to cost \$2,917 dollars from Earl May with 2-year warranties on the trees. Barnhill motioned to approve the cost of planting the trees, Wapelhorst seconded, roll call: All yays no nays, motion carried.

- 4. Update on locations of side street planters Geary said that One Office has taken 4 of the planters and Joseph's College has also taken some. More businesses will be contacted to see if they would take care of the planters.
- 5. Update on original street scape plans and estimated timeline for side street improvements moved to future agenda
- 6. Discussion on strategic plan: Mission and Vision Statements, future property adjustments, and boundary expansions. Moved to future agenda
